Post-secondary students in the State of Mississippi often choose to attend a Mississippi community college (MS CC) and earn an associate degree before transferring to The University of Southern Mississippi to complete their bachelor's degree. To make this transition as smooth as possible and to ensure no credits are lost, we have created this transfer guide. In most, but not all, cases, students may complete a bachelor's degree in what we refer to as a '2+2' format:

2 years at a MS CC for an associate degree, which includes general education coursework
 +
 2 years at USM to complete the bachelor's degree

Please use the key below to determine which courses you must, should, or could take at a Mississippi community college before transferring to Southern Miss.

KEY



MUST	Students who do not complete these requirements at a MS CC cannot complete their bachelor's degree in the 2+2 format.
SHOULD	Students should complete these requirements at a MS CC in order to have the smoothest transition to Southern Miss. It may still be possible to complete a bachelor's degree in the 2+2 format without taking these courses, but it will be challenging.
COULD	Students could complete these requirements at a MS CC if they desire. Not taking these courses prior to transferring will not affect a student's ability to complete their bachelor's degree in the 2+2 format.
CALCULUS READINESS	Calculus is required on this degree plan. Students should arrive at Southern Miss ready to take Calculus I, which means they must have completed Trigonometry or have a Math ACT subscore ≥ 26 . Students may complete Calculus I prior to transferring if they desire.

NOTE: *This document is intended as a guide; it does not guarantee graduation in the 2+2 format. Degree requirements are subject to change. Please consult the school of your desired major for up-to-date requirements.*

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

The Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies (BIS) is for students who are:

- Motivated and creative and want to do something a little different.
- Interested in multiple majors but still want to graduate in four years.
- Looking for a specific degree not offered at USM.

Students intentionally design an academic path that incorporates their interests and talents. Options include:

- Selecting a minimum of two concentrations of 18 hours each. Choose from a large selection of academic minors or create an 18-hour concentration.
- Select a single 36-hour concentration. Choose an established specialty concentration (environmental studies or disability studies) or design an individualized concentration in consultation with an advisor.

RESEARCH AT USM

The BIS degree is research/project focused:

- Students take the IDS 401 and IDS 402 sequence in which they complete a comprehensive, interdisciplinary, research-based project, which culminates the degree.
- Students are encouraged to present their research at USM's Undergraduate Symposium on Research and Creative Activity.

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LIBERAL STUDIES

The Bachelor of Liberal Studies (BLS) is for students who:

- Have broad interests.
- Have taken courses in a variety of academic areas.
- Require a flexible schedule such as those in the military.
- Started a degree, then took time away, and now would like to complete a degree.
- Are mid-career professionals who seek a bachelor's degree for advancement in their field.

Students choose from a variety of courses in three of the following academic areas:

- Arts & Media, Business
- Health & Education
- Humanities & Communication
- Social Sciences & Interdisciplinary Studies
- Science & Engineering

Students also select a minor or 18-hour concentration.

CAREER READINESS

- Both the BIS and BLS degrees broadly prepare students for a variety of career opportunities.
- Both degrees can be tailored for students who want to pursue a pre-professional curriculum (law or health).
- Both degrees encourage students to pursue internships, practicums, and other experiential learning activities to build core skills for career success.

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES BIS 2+2



Students interested in the BIS degree should contact the School of Interdisciplinary Studies and Professional Development as soon as possible. Designing this degree requires consultation with a USM advisor and a school-director approved concentration proposal.

Three ways to design your BIS degree:

- Create a 36 hour concentration in consultation with a USM advisor.
- Choose an existing specialty concentration: Environmental Studies or Disability Studies.
- Choose two minors as your concentration areas.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN BLS V.S. BIS?

- The Liberal Studies BLS is more appropriate for transfer students than new, first-time college students (traditional freshmen).
- The Liberal Studies BLS has slightly more structure than the Interdisciplinary Studies BIS in that students are required to take courses in (3) different academic areas. It has less coherence in that the courses do not have to have any thematic connection.
- Both degrees are very flexible but neither is the "take anything you want" degree. Students must follow the degree plan in the bulletin.
- Neither degree is a "general studies" degree.
