AN ACT to establish the Mississippi Normal College to qualify teachers for the public schools; to provide for the government thereof; to provide how the location shall be made and the buildings constructed, and for other purposes.

MISSISSIPPI NORMAL COLLEGE ESTABLISHED.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That a body politic and corporate is hereby created by the name of the Mississippi Normal College, (to cost not more than one hundred thousand dollars) to have perpetual succession, with power to contract and be contracted with, to receive by any legal method of transfer or conveyance, property of any description, and to have and hold and employ the same; also, to make and use a corporate seal, with power to break or change the same; to adopt by-laws, rules and regulations for the government of its members, official agents and employees.

OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF MISSISSIPPI NORMAL COLLEGE.

Sec. 2. The object of the said Mississippi Normal College shall be to qualify teachers for the public schools of this State, by imparting instruction in the art and practice of teaching in all branches of study which pertain to a common school education, and such other studies as the board of trustees may from time to time prescribe.

RESTRICTIONS AS TO ADMISSION.

But no one shall be eligible to admission to such school, who shall not have completed the studies or course prescribed by law for the common or public schools of the State and the course in such school shall always be confined or restricted to a strictly normal or professional course for training teachers to teach in the public schools of the State.
