#### **Using Resources to Revise Your Courses**

As you start to prepare for fall, we wanted to remind you of several CFD resources we have available to help. If you are looking for new ideas to save time, brush up your Canvas skills, or get some great ideas for activities, consider attending our Plan, Prepare, and Engage workshop series.

If reviewing resources on your own is more your speed, check out our **Teaching Resources** on the CFD webpage, along with our other **resources for Research**, **Leadership**, **and University Processes**. There you'll find the most up-to-date **syllabus template** to use for your courses as well as several articles and resources to spice up your teaching, especially under our Teaching Toolkits that cover topics such as course design basics, teaching online, and creating more inclusive environments.

Given all the talk on Artificial Intelligence, we have just added more resources to our Teaching Toolkit on Teaching with Artificial Intelligence. Among these new resources, here our some of our new favorites:

- From Oregon State University, Bloom's Taxonomy Revisited highlights which
  types of tasks and assignments we may need to revise given Al's current
  capabilities so that you can ensure that your course advances meaningful
  learning opportunities in the age of Al.
- ACUE's 10 Best Practices for Al Assignments in Higher Ed also is helpful in considering integration of Al into our course.

If these resources spark your curiosity about AI, join us for our Fall First Week keynote address, Al's Implications for Higher Education: Preparing Students for Success Beyond College by C. Edward Watson on Friday, August 16<sup>th</sup> at 9 -10 am in Bennett Auditorium. If you are ready to dig into some hands-on work on integrating AI into your course, register to attend Exploring AI for Teaching and Learning: A hands-on workshop offered later that afternoon.

Our best advice is to pick two to three things to revise this year that may have the biggest impact, such as revamping an assignment or adding some active learning activities, rather than trying to overhaul everything at once.
