This includes an upgrade to Axon Body 3 Black Rapid lock cameras along with cables, docking stations, wall mounts assembly, Extended Warranty for Camera (TAP), Evidence.Com Licenses, 10 GB of Evidence.com Storage, Professional Evidence.com Licenses, and 10GB of Evidence.Com Storage.

Data issues such as security, audits of modifications, backup, etc. are managed in the cloud. Not having to provide
