USM Libraries requires a comprehensive and flexible discovery tool to integrate the multiple platforms, databases, and collections needed by the University community into a single search, that does not require a developer to configure.

2. Explanation of why the commodity is the only one that meets the needs of the agency:

Only Ex Libris' Primo allows us to normalize the data from each system -- including but not limited to Alma, ArchivesSpace, CONTENTdm, Digital Commons, Preservica, and The Ex Libris Central Discovery Index (CDI) -- into the same interface, regardless of its original format, without the need for a developer or maintaining our own technical infrastructure. Additionally, the platform must support multiple search views with independent branding and the ability to customize the search data for each view.

3. Explanation of why the source is the only source is the only person or entity that can provide the required commodity:

Primo VE is proprietary and only available from Ex Libris.

Other comparable discovery solutions do not meet our requirements. Some solutions such as Blacklight and Vufind are open source and necessitate having a standalone server as well as a full-time developer on staff, which University Libraries does not have. Some other solutions will only bring together one or two systems but not all our systems.

4. Explanation of why the amount to be expended for the commodity is reasonable:

The amount for the software is lower than the annual salary for a qualified developer.

5. Efforts that the agency went through to obtain the best possible price for the commodity:

The price was negotiated down from a 5% increase per year to a 2% increase per year.
