RISE To The Top! is USM's inclusive 4-year, 8 semester non-degree certificate program for students with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities that focuses on the following: academics, community engagement-, employment preparation-, and student life. Equip streamlines administrative tasks, enhances student engagement, and facilitates communication between students, educators, and support staff. Key Features of Equip include student-centered planning, course and program management, communication tools, accessibility & inclusivity, data tracking and reporting, and employment & career readiness. Equip helps IPSE programs operate efficiently, ensuring that students with intellectual disabilities receive the support, structure, and opportunities they need to succeed in college and beyond.
